IV State Issues:

- The Committee members are asked to review the 2016 State Legislative Matrix as provided by the City's State Advocate, Townsend Public Affairs, and to provide initial direction regarding stances on upcoming legislation. (Attachment 1)
 - Discussion of bills to oppose and watch (AB 2500 and SB 876)

V Regional Issues:

- Request for a letter of opposition to AB 1707 (Linder), which requires a response to a written request for public records that includes a denial of the request, in whole or in part, to be in writing. (Attachment 2 – League of California Cities Sample Opposition Letter)
- Request for a letter of support to AB 2772 (Chang), which will allow judges, who are ordering defendants to be cared for in residential treatment environments, to choose or approve only the residential treatment homes that are (1) compliant with their state licensure agreement and (2) are compliant with the local ordinances within the city of its location. The intent of this bill is to enable cities to maintain oversight of which homes are being utilized by the courts, and to ensure that individuals receive the most reliable care from credible and compliant sober living facilities. (Attachment 3 – Sample Support Letter)
- Request for letter of opposition to AB 2614 (Bonta), would prevent the Department of Consumer Affairs from denying a State license to a person with an out-of-state conviction. This legislation would provide that such a conviction cannot be the sole basis for denial of a license if it did not include a period of incarceration, and if a local jurisdiction is aware of the conviction and is nonetheless willing to issue a local permit or other authorization. The bill disregards consensus language on disqualifying felonies for State licensure that the League of California Cities and the California Police Chiefs Association agreed to in last year's

legislation, re-opening one of the most controversial issues in the Medical Marijuana and Safety Act. (Attachment 4 – League of Cities Sample Opposition Letter)
