**POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORT:** Chief Robert Handy reported:

- PD is in back to school mode, motor officers addressing ongoing issues
- School traffic at the beginning of the year is better than last year
- Football games were good last week
- Vicki Shroyer has retired and is replaced by Joel Peterson. Mr. Peterson lives in HB and is very involved in the youth programs. He will be joined by Derek Young in the Youth Enforcement Team.

**Round Table Discussion:**

**Fountain Valley School District** – Ian Collins reported for Dr. Johnson:

- Heat has been an issue this year
- Attendance projection to be “right on”
- \$35M invested to generate revenue
- FVSD Golf Tournament on 10/5 at Mile Square
- Broadcom Science Award finalist
- District is working on staff development
- Test scores were quite good
- Ian Collins welcomed Carol Hansen back to the area

**HB City School District** – Shari Kowalke reported:

- First week has been great
- Hired a new Assistant Superintendent of Human Resources
- Education Foundation planning events related to “Holiday Shopping”

- Lower classroom sizes means lots of new teachers
- New music programs including vocal and key board teachers

**HB Union High School District** – Greg Plutko and Susan Henry reported:

- Smooth start of the new year
- Four new principals were hired
- Enrollment down a bit this school year
- Received a \$500K Grant for bus improvements
- Ramping up for additional teacher training
- Funding remains limited
- Attendance is down about 290 District-wide, which impacts funding. District will analyze where students went if they did not return to school.
- On-line school in South County is growing

**Ocean View School District** – Carol Hansen reported:

- Have hired a new Superintendent, Deputy Superintendent and Assistant Superintendent are also new
- New Superintendent, Carol Hansen, came from ABS School District and Westminster School District
- Hope View is opening with great improvements to the facility
- Enrollment is higher than expected, though down a bit from last year
- Oak View students are still in portables
- Lake View students are at Westmont School
- All OVSD students are home

**Ocean View School District** – Gina Clayton-Tarvin reported:

- Expressed gratitude to the schools that assisted through difficult times
- Enrollment down, so District will be analyzing where these students are attending school
- Census data suggests that there should be 14K students, however, there are only 9K students
- OVSD is receiving students from Albert Eisenstein Academy, which is closing
- Litigation with Republic is progressing with the District being willing to work with Republic on a solution
- Field allocation processes should be discussed
- Sports Complex fields not available for practices

**Westminster School District** – No Report

Mayor Jill Hardy reported:

- The Albert Einstein Academy was able to provide smaller class sizes and language emersion for K-8
- City needs to meet regarding field allocations
