APRIL DONATION UPDATE

The Huntington Beach Neighborhood Watch Program (HBNW) **fiscal year** is from July 1 to June 30 each year. We have estimated we will need approximately \$24,300 this year to cover the various HBNW program expenses which include, but are not limited to, newsletter assembly, distribution costs, returned postage, mailing labels, etc. From the start of our fiscal year to now, we have received **\$16,376.49 in donations and newsletter advertisements— we have \$7,923.51 to go by June 30, 2014.** The HBNW Board thanks you and our advertisers for your support and generous donations. An \$8 donation pays for each subscriber's distribution costs; a \$10 donation helps with these costs and other needed expenses and puts your name in the Newsletter as a contributor; and a \$25 or more donation accomplishes the above, plus you will receive a HBNW sticker and a token of appreciation. **National Law
Enforcement Week**

(Blue Ribbon Week)

May 11th to 17th 2014



The Blue Ribbon Campaign focuses awareness on issues involving law enforcement, their sacrifices, and the heroes killed each year in the line of duty. In 2013 there were 105 Line of Duty Deaths nationwide; of these men and women 10 were from California.

Every day when an Officer leaves his/her home and family to go off to work, they do not know if they will return home safely. They do it anyway because of the honor and commitment they have to keep us safe and the oath they took to selflessly serve and protect.

Fifty-two years ago, in 1962, President John F. Kennedy signed Public law 87-726 designating May 15th as Peace Officers' Memorial Day and the week in which May 15th falls as National Police Week. The law was amended by the Violent Crime Control and Law Enforcement Act of 1994, Public Law 103-322, signed by President Bill Clinton, directing that the flag of the United States be displayed at half-staff on all government buildings on May 15th each year. While the actual date changes from year to year, National Police Week is always the calendar week beginning on the Sunday which includes May 15th.

Show your support for our Officers and all police personnel (support staff) by displaying a **blue ribbon** on your home, vehicle, and where you work. You can pick up a few **blue ribbons** at the front counter of the Huntington Beach Police Department.

You can drop off a card at the HBPD front counter or have your child draw a picture to tell these brave men and women thank you for their sacrifice and the service they provide.


