Memorial Day Holiday will Affect Street Sweeping and Trash Collection

In observance of Memorial Day on Monday, May 25, trash collection and street sweeping will be on holiday schedule. Trash will not be collected on Monday, May 25. All residents should place trash for collection the day after their regular route day. For example, residents on Monday's route should place their trash for collection on Tuesday, Tuesday's route on Wednesday, and so on for the entire week. Friday's route will be collected on Saturday.

The regular collection schedule resumes on Monday, June 1.

There will be no street sweeping on Monday, May 25 (fourth Monday route). Streets that are not swept due to holidays are not rescheduled. Due to the holiday trash collection schedule, trash carts are at the curb one day later than usual, which conflicts with scheduled sweeping days in many neighborhoods. Residents should place trash carts at the curb per the holiday schedule. Neighborhoods that can be efficiently swept will be swept per regular schedule. Example: where trash is collected from a rear alley. Neighborhoods that are impacted by trash carts at the curb will not be swept.

Rain barrels are available for \$85, with a \$75 rebate from the Municipal Water District of Orange County, that brings your final cost to just \$10 each!



Environmental Documents

Draft Negative Declaration No. 11-005 is available for a 30-day public review and comment period commencing Thursday, May 14, 2015, and ending Friday, June 12, 2015. The project analyzes the potential environmental impacts associated with a “Tree Trimming and Management Plan” that will be implemented at the Tennis Estates Homeowners Association property. The “Tree Trimming and Management Plan” addresses maintenance and management procedures of trees on the subject site, including those that have the potential to provide heronry functions (e.g.- nesting, roosting, cover/protection) for birds protected under the Migratory Bird Treaty Act.

The project location is 16380 Wimbledon Lane, which is located at the southwest corner of Humboldt Drive and Saybrook Lane. A copy of the Draft Negative Declaration is on file with the Planning & Building Department, City of Huntington Beach City Hall, 2000 Main Street, Huntington Beach, California; the Central Library, 7111 Talbert Avenue, Huntington Beach, California; the City Clerk’s Office, 2000 Main Street, Second Floor, Huntington Beach, California; and on the City’ website at:

Subsequent to the comment period, a public hearing will be scheduled before the Huntington Beach Zoning Administrator. The public hearing is tentatively scheduled for July 1, 2015. 
Structure Fire

On May 8, at approximately 4 a.m., fire department units were dispatched to the Denny's restaurant at Beach and Ellis for a report of smoke inside the building. On arrival, firefighters found a single-story restaurant with no signs of a fire from the outside. Personnel began investigating inside the structure and found moderate smoke coming from the recessed lights in the entry and main dining area. The fire had to be accessed from the roof where it was quickly located and extinguished. The fire appeared to be caused by an electrical failure in the soffit space. Damage was limited to the soffit space and roof above it as well as the drop ceiling in the restaurant entry area.

HBFA at the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation Great Strides 5K Walk

On Saturday, May 16, the Huntington Beach Firefighters' Association (HBFA) cooked approximately 1,500 hotdogs and distributed bags of chips to feed the more than 1,200 participants in support of the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation Great Strides 5K walk. The Cystic Fibrosis Foundation raised nearly \$280,000 towards finding a cure. Huntington Beach is ranked in the "Top 10 Great Strides" walks in the nation for 2015.


